What is your project about?

ODECO (Towards a sustainable open data ecosystem) aims at transforming the current open data systems to open data ecosystems. The central aim of the ODECO network is to train the next generation of creative and innovative early-stage open data researchers, to unlock their creative and

innovative potential to address current and future challenges in the creation of user driven, circular and inclusive open data ecosystems.

Why is your project important for society?

ODECO's training design is based on existing initiatives to map and define skills essential open data and knowledge. considering the main challenges in future open data research and practice in society. ODECO will deliver the next generation of leaders who will use their experiences and connections to create new companies and research groups, as well as develop and implement future open data policies.

What communication and public engagement measures have you foreseen?

ODECO disseminated project results to the professional community (policy



makers and industry) and the scientific community, through targeted and focused activities using a specialised language, and to citizens, in non-specialist language. The means for dissemination are scientific articles, blogposts, social media posts, Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC), case studies analysis, website.

What kind of support did you get?
